For CEDIT Matteo Nunziati designs Tesori, a series of ceramic slabs inspired by fabrics and decorations, along two sensual horizons: one geographical and the other time-based.

His many journeys all over the world have enabled this architect to sample a variety of languages, which in this expressive composition are superimposed to create innovative works. In Tesori, stylistic and cultural influences from distant ages and far-flung countries are reflected through the impressions created by fabrics and decorations, reinterpreted through the designer's Italian identity for a very original expressive composition.

Biography and projects

Matteo Nunziati is an architect and designer who founded his interior architecture firm in Milan in 2000: its product design division works with some of the leading furniture, lighting and ornament producers (including Poliform, Molteni, Flou, Poltrone Frau, Gruppo Martini Illuminazione and Murrina). He specialises in the design of luxury hotels, wellness centres, spas and residential projects, which he has built all over the world, and he is particularly well known in the Middle East.

He has taught at the Domus Academy and the Taipei Industrial Design Department since 2004. His projects have been published in the top Italian and international design journals. SKY TV has covered his work in the Design sector in a series of four programmes.

He won the Chicago USA 2011 Good Design Award for Rapsel's Elle washbasin and the 2011 United Kingdom Wallpaper Design Award for Matteograssi's Dali Coffee Table. He also won the 2013 Saudi Arabia Cityscape Award for the best residential architecture project.
